





EFCC Mission Trip to Africa

This past month, four EFCC members traveled to Kenya and Uganda on a mission trip. Joe You, Rebecca Geary, Luke B., and Anna Nielsen first arrived in Nairobi, Kenya, to meet global partners, New Generations and attend Catalyst Camp, a week-long training and reporting conference for African disciple-makers. There were people from 47 countries, representing hundreds of thousands of new Jesus-followers across the continent.

Attendees shared progress updates from their various regions. Many of the stories involved war-torn countries and intense persecution. Through it all, these faithful men and women remain committed to sharing the Gospel with their communities.

One night of Catalyst Camp was dedicated to praying for the nations of the world.

While the prayer started in Africa, the night ended with attendees gathering around flags from each country. It was incredibly moving to see people from all nations clutching the hem of an American flag and praying fervently for Jesus' Kingdom to reign in the United States.

The team left Catalyst Camp inspired by those they met and convicted to continue to pray for the spread of the Gospel to all people.

The team traveled to Uganda for five more days. They visited different regions of the country learning about Ugandan culture and the many ministry opportunities available.

They received a warm African welcome at the KidsCare Primary School, where over 600 children lined the driveway performing drums and traditional dances. The team then was invited to watch the school field day, where teams of students competed in sporting events for a grand prize — a goat!

The schools the team visited offer more than an education to Ugandan children. Many families are parent-less due to the HIV epidemic. Poverty and unemployment is high and access to medical care is limited. At school, children receive a Christian education, nutritious meals, safe places to stay, and medical care. They are encouraged to learn vocational skills and many children become young entrepreneurs, raising livestock or growing gardens. School represents hope for the future of Uganda.

The team joined in student-led worship services at Cream Hill Secondary School. Students at this school are orphaned or extremely poor. Their songs of hope brought tears to the team's eyes during worship.

The team visited a men's prison, traveled to an impoverished fishing village, and even rode along on medical calls to elders living in remote villages. There is great need in a country like Uganda but also incredible beauty in the faces of the people and warm hospitality Ugandans are famous for.

EFCC Outreach remains committed to sharing the Gospel of Jesus' Kingdom with the least reached people of the world. Africa harbors the most unreached people groups, with nearly 30% of the continent falling into this category.

There are many ways to engage in this Great Commission work. We look forward to strengthening the relationships with African disciple-makers and bringing teams to work alongside many of them in the future.
